On the Topic of Angels: What are Archangels? An Archangel is an Angel of a higher rank. The English word "archangel" is derived from the Greek ἀρχάνγελος (arch + angel,) literally "chief angel". It is twice in the New Testament: in the *phrase* "with the voice of the Archangel, and with the trumpet call of God" (1 Thessalonians 4:16); and in relation to the "Archangel Michael" (Jude 9). The Hebrew Old Testament has "Michael, one of the chief princes" (Dan 10:13), and, "Michael, the great prince" (Dan 12:1).

"Archangels have the monumental task of **managing life on Earth**, including the creation and facilitation of soul contracts, life paths, the spiritual development of souls, order within the natural world, and more. Each Archangel has a different area of expertise which works in conjunction with all of the other Archangels to ensure the best possible journeys for all on Earth while working in tandem with Heaven and God's plans."

The name **Michael,** signifies "Who is like to God?" (In the Hebrew Language - מיכאל - "ēl" means "God", and, "mīkhā" means "image of") and it was the war cry of the good angels in the battle fought in Heaven against Satan and his followers. Michael is "one of the chief Princes," and leader of the forces of Heaven in their triumph over the powers of Hell. From the time of the Apostles and by the Church, he has been especially honored and invoked as **Patron and Protector**. *Michael* is the **Patron** of mariners, paratroopers, police, military, EMT's, and other such occupations of risk. (see all on the internet). Feast Day is this September 29th.



Distorted steel girders from the World Trade Center adorn the Knights of Columbus Museum. A plaque lists the names of those killed: **45 Knights** — 11 firefighters, 6 policemen, 28 civilians, and a member on Flight 11.

September 11, 2001, was an American tragedy that brought out Knights who actively embodied the Order's principles of charity and patriotism. Councils sponsored prayer vigils, fundraisers, blood drives. and our Board of Directors created a \$1 million "Heroes Fund" Program wherein families of killed first responders were given an emergency stipend, regardless of their membership or religious tradition. From September 2001 to July 2002, the Order's field force delivered 419 checks to families of perished firefighters, law enforcement officers, and emergency medical personnel. The Heroes Fund closed in July 2002 and was the end of the Order's most noteworthy program.

The Knights of Columbus were there with immediate needs, and to show somebody out there cared! *It touched a lot of people in a lot of good ways - our heart is charity.*

Father McGivney eye-witnessed misfortune but could of never imagined an event like these attacks. *He would have been proud of what his Knights accomplished in the months — and years — that followed.*

The Very First Winner! - a K of C Member!

A most distinguished victory in Olympic History occurred 125 years ago, when **James Connolly** won the *very first event* of the 1896 *Modern* Olympic Games. A feisty and energetic 27-year-old, he became the first Olympic champion in more than 1,500 years.

Abolished in 393 AD by Emperor Theodosius I, the *old* Olympic Games lay dormant until their 1896 revival in Athens. The United States fielded 12 athletes. To qualify, one had to fill out an entry form and pay their way to Greece. *Connolly signed up!*

James Brendan Connolly was born October 28, 1868, as one of 12 children and the sixth of 10 sons, to Irish immigrants from Inis Mór, Aran Islands, Ireland — fisherman John Connolly and Ann (O'Donnell). Connolly was full of boundless enterprise and imagination. After working as a clerk, he joined the Army Corps of Engineers, founded a football club, wrote a sports column for a newspaper, and established a bicycling team. In 1890, he won the National AAU triple jump championship. In 1895, being uneducated, he took Harvard's entrance exam and was accepted!!

In 1896 the Olympics were revived and Connolly desired to compete, so he quit Harvard, and gained sponsorship from the Athletic Club of Boston plus with his family's Catholic parish, raised money that carried him across the Atlantic for the start on Easter Monday, April 6, 1896. The young American trained on the deck of the ship, traveled 16 days, and arrived on Easter Sunday, April 5 — Connolly's event was in two days on April 7!

80,000 spectators watched. *There were no trials;* three jumps would determine the winner. Connolly leaped 45 feet and astonished the crowd. *"You are the victor of the first Olympic event!,"* was said to Connolly. A band played the Star-Spangled Banner and the American Flag was raised (see photo). Connolly was crowned with an olive wreath and received the top medal. The following year, he set a new triple-jump record of 49 feet, which stood for 13 years and not matched in Olympic competition until 1924.

After athletic competitions and succeeding as a journalistauthor, Connolly resided in Boston, and became a Member of the **Knights of Columbus, Back Bay Council 331** (Still active to this day!).


In 1898, at the outbreak of the Spanish-American War, he enlisted with the Ninth Massachusetts Infantry and fought at San Juan Hill in Cuba. Afterwards, he married Elizabeth Hurley and had a daughter, Brenda. To issue war reports, President Roosevelt granted Connolly permission to serve in the US Navy, but under an assumed name. During World War I, as a journalist, he covered U-boat action for magazines, met Pope Pius X, and first-hand reported on the Irish War of Independence.

Connolly authored over 25 novels and 200 short stories based on his extensive maritime travels. For this, he was officially dubbed "America's best writer of sea stories."

James Brendan Bennet "Jamie" Connolly ~~~ (Irish: Séamas Breandán Ó Conghaile, October 28, 1868 – January 20, 1957) died in New York City on January 20, 1957, at the age of 88.
